TOPCLIFFE & ASENBY PRODUCE SHOW RULES

1. Individual exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that they comply with the rules of the produce show.
2. Participation in the show is open only to residents of Topcliffe and Asenby, registered owners at Swale Caravan Park and to individuals who grow produce on allotments within the boundaries of either village.
3. Classes 1 – 76 are open to all. Classes 77 - 81 are open only to children aged a maximum of 15 years on the day of the show.
4. All exhibits must have been grown by, or be the work of, the exhibitor.
5. No entries are permitted from professional or commercial concerns.
6. All entries should be taken to the Village Hall between 9.00am and 11.30am on the day of the show for registration and tabling. Numbered tickets will be handed out for each exhibit.
7. An entry fee of 50p will be charged per adult exhibit and 25p per child's entry.
8. Generally, horticultural exhibits must be displayed on napkins supplied on the day by the Produce Show organisers. Larger exhibits – classes 10, 14, 15, 16, 23 and 38 – are exempted from this rule.
9. Classes 4 to 7 must be displayed on rings (maximum 15mm height).
10. Class 8 – shallots may be exhibited on rings or a bed of sand or both.
11. Classes 25 and 46 – exhibitors must provide their own plain white dinner plate for showing their 'four vegetables' or 'four fruits'. All four exhibits must sit within the circumference of the plate.
12. All entries in hobbies category (Classes 67 to 76) and children's category (Classes 77 to 81) must have been created in the twelve months prior to the show.
13. Watercolour painting exhibits must not exceed 54 x 44cm (22 x 17 inches), including the frame.
14. There is no restriction on the size allowed for oil paintings.
15. Photographic exhibits can be colour or black & white. Maximum size A4 (297 x 210mm). No frames allowed.
16. Each exhibitor will be restricted to a maximum two entries in any class.
17. All exhibitors must leave the village hall by 12 noon.
18. Judging takes place between 12 noon and 2pm.
19. Judges are at liberty to taste entries in the baking section and classes 80 and 81 of the children's section.
20. The judge's decision regarding quality of exhibits is final.
21. Complaints or objections about any matter must be raised with the Produce Show Secretary before 3pm on the day of the show. Any disputes will be settled by the Produce Show Committee, whose decision is final.
22. The appointment of judges rests with the Produce Show Committee.
23. Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. The judges may, at their discretion, decide to award highly commended certificates.
24. In the horticultural section, 3 points will be awarded for a 1st; 2 for a 2nd and 1 for a 3rd. The exhibitor with most points wins the Produce Show Trophy.
25. The trophy is the property of the Produce Show Committee and is presented to the winner on the understanding that it will be returned by the following show date.
26. Public viewing will be between 2 and 3.30pm. The Raffle and presentation of the Produce Show Trophy will be at 3pm.
27. Exhibits and prize cards should not be removed before 3.30pm but must be removed by 4pm.
28. The Produce Show Committee and the Village Hall Committee are not responsible for loss or damage to exhibits or exhibitor's equipment.
