School Report by Simon Ashby (Headteacher) (School Web Site www.topcliffe.n-yorks.sch.uk

At the time of writing (14 May)plans are being drawn up for our hall extension and our phase 2 bid to the New Opportunities fund is about to be submitted. One of the off-shoots of the project will hopefully be the development of the school playground to create more space for the children. The Friends of Topcliffe School have agreed to support this venture and we have set the ambitious target of raising £5000 by next year.



Our work towards this was greatly helped on Shrove Tuesday, when children from Class 4 went along to the Crab & Lobster restaurant to take part in a Pancake Race. The event was very enjoyable for all of the children, not least because of the wonderful refreshments served up afterwards inside the restaurant. The school had been very kindly nominated as the charity to benefit from the event, and in the end £1150 was raised towards our playground fund, which was absolutely fantastic and greatly appreciated by everyone.

We would like to express our thanks once again to everyone who supported the recent collection of used clothing. This raised £122 towards school funds which is tremendous. Also, many thanks to everyone who helped with our collection of Tesco "Computers for Schools" vouchers and Nestle "Box Tops".

School Summer Fayre: Sat 28th June 2-4 pm

The major fundraising event for FOTS this term will be our Summer Fayre, which will take place at school on Saturday 28th June

between 2 and 4 pm. The event promises to be great fun again, with a "Welly Wanging" contest being added to the usual attractions this year. Children will also be taking part in a marathon 2 hour sponsored skip.

The school is currently involved in two national accreditation schemes. If we are successful we hope that some time next year we will achieve the "Healthy Schools Standard" and gain "Active Mark" status. Both schemes focus on the overall personal, social and health education in school.

To this end, children have been involved! in a number of extra "healthy" activities over the last term. When the "Freddie Fit" project visited school all of the children had 2 hours of very active (but fun) activity, interspersed aerobic learning about their bodies and fitness. The project came back to school in March for an after-school session which was attended by over half of the children! We have also benefited from football all children coaching sessions for through the Umbro "School's Football Initiative" and at the minute coaches from Sunderland AFC's Football Community scheme are visiting school. For the last year all the users of the hall have had their heating costs free as, following the installation of the gas heating system, the Parish Council paid for the first year's gas bill. Prior to the installation of the gas heating everyone had to shovel pound coins into the electric meters to pay for the electric heating. Now, unfortunately, it is time to set the hall rates at such a level that the gas bills AND the yearly maintenance of the heaters is paid for. We have looked at the yearly costs and the number of lettings over the year and basically it means adding £1 per hour to all the letting rates. Hence the rates will be as follows:

Regular club Users £4/hour
Parishioners £4.50 / hour £30 / day
Non- Parishioners £7 / hour £60 / day
Parish Council £8 per session
Other charges remain the same.

The new rates will apply from 1st June 2003





the improvement of our results since 1999. Whilst everyone at the school firmly believes that there is far more to education and childhood than test results, it is nonetheless pleasing to receive recognition in this way.

Their first achievement has been to draft and agree a bullying policy for the school, which will be presented to the Governing Body later this term. Minutes of their meetings are displayed in the school entrance.
