The registration trigger level of 150, set by BT for Topcliffe, was reached in October meaning that Broadband will now come to Topcliffe. The 'enablement' of Topcliffe will happen on 4<sup>th</sup> Feb 2004, with ISPs now taking pre-orders for broadband. Residential customers and businesses in the Dalton area may also be able to access the Topcliffe enablement dependent on their distance from the Topcliffe exchange as the distance that broadband will run from an exchange has just been increased to 6km. #### Use it or lose it!

The village hall has been the one of the centres of the community for many years but it would seem that many of the people who are happy to make use of its heavily subsidised prices are reluctant to support the fundraising efforts of the committee.

The concerts (which with the support of Rural Arts) are usually first class acts from London have been very poorly supported of late, and indeed the last one on the 17th of October actually made a loss.

It was noted amongst the committee that very few, if any, members of the groups who use the hall were present. Indeed, they had not been present at any of the previous ventures. The audiences were generally made up of the committee, and their friends and families - many from outside the area.

If this continues the only way to remain solvent will be to make swingeing increases to the rental arrangements for these regular users, and indeed to the irregular users (birthday parties etc.), to enable the necessary repairs to be carried out and the books to be balanced.

There will be another performance in the spring and after that performance the Village Hall Committee may need to review the rental arrangements.

### Editorial

In this issue of the TATtler we are re-publishing the Crime Survey Questionnaire, which we ran in September, and a letter concerning the Village Hall. There is also an appeal for Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators to replace two residents who have left, or will be leaving, Topcliffe.

The Crime Survey produced the magnificent response of 3 replies. TATtler goes out to nearly 280 homes in Topcliffe alone. The view of the Parish Council is that although crime is an issue discussed by parishioners, it is not perceived to be a problem since only three of us took the trouble to complete the questionnaire. Is that the case, or is there a problem to be addressed? A completed questionnaire, which says there is no problem, is better than no answer at all.

The letter concerning the Village Hall refers to the abysmal turnout for the concert held in October. This was a first class performance and yet only 30 souls managed to make the effort to attend. They all had a great night.

We're very lucky in Topcliffe and Asenby to have so many people willing to give up their time to make our communities a better place in which to live. But they need the support of us all. We only get the community we deserve.

So at this time when we remember the birth of Christ, let there be Peace on earth and Goodwill to all men, especially those in your village! (I'm not trying to encroach on Christine's patch here!)

Existing members will be only too pleased to welcome and help newcomers should they need it.



#### School Report by Simon Ashby (Headteacher)

We have had an eventful Autumn term at school and are looking forward to the Christmas period. We are very pleased that our bid to Sport England has finally been approved for the development of the hall. In the end we have received a grant of £72000. We have also successfully applied for additional funding of £8000 from the Local Education Authority's "Seed Challenge" funding, which we now need to match with £6000 raised by ourselves. This all means that we hope our building



project will soon get off the ground, and should result in a vast improvement of the school's facilities.

Fundraising activities by the Friends of Topcliffe School continue to be very successful in our attempts to raise the necessary £6000 mentioned above. At the end of last term our Summer Fayre and end of term performance and barbecue raised around £1600. This term the recent collection of used clothing raised a further £220. Many thanks to everyone who contributed bags of clothes for this. We are currently looking forward to our Christmas Fayre, at the village hall on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> November at 2:00 pm.

The school football team performed superbly on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> October in the Hambleton area 6-a-side competition. They came up against a number of large schools from the area, but nonetheless battled their way through to the last 8 from 20 schools. The following Thursday they also performed heroically, but were beaten into second place in their group, narrowly missing the final.

School children will be singing carols at the Crab & Lobster restaurant on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December at the Topcliffe & Asenby Senior Citizen's Christmas Lunch. The carols which we will be singing on the day will

form part of this year's Christmas nativity performance. This will take place on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> December at

6.30pm in St. Columba's church. Everyone is welcome to attend, and participation with the carols will be encouraged.

Finally, children from our eldest class have been involved in an exciting design and technology project looking at fairground rides. They have produced some work especially for a DT website (www.dtonline.org/structures/) for which they received a special grant giving them free entry to Flamingo Land. The work has also earned them headline status on North Yorkshire's education service web site. The children are currently designing and making their own working models.

**<u>CHRISTINGLE</u>** This service, which takes place at 3.30 pm on Sunday December 14<sup>th</sup>, is especially suitable for families. The meaning of the Christingle orange will be explained before the oranges are lit (their candles, that is) and distributed to every child. Children from Topcliffe C.E. School will be taking part and everyone will join in singing Christmas carols. The service, which originated in Moravia, was rediscovered some years ago by the Children's Society and so – appropriately – all the collection taken will be given to help their valuable work.

<u>The CRIB SERVICE</u> which takes place at 3.00 pm on Christmas Eve is magical in the truest sense of the word, and is suitable for even the youngest children. As the animals and figures are placed in the Christmas Crib, the timeless story of the first Christmas unfolds. Members of the Children's Church participate and together we join in the singing of carols. This service is an oasis (though not usually a quiet one!) in the midst of the busy preparations for Christmas Day. We are reminded of the true meaning of Christmas in the coming of the Christ Child to be 'God with us'. The service lasts approximately half an hour and is followed by seasonal refreshments of sherry (adults only!) and mince pies. Please come and join us.
